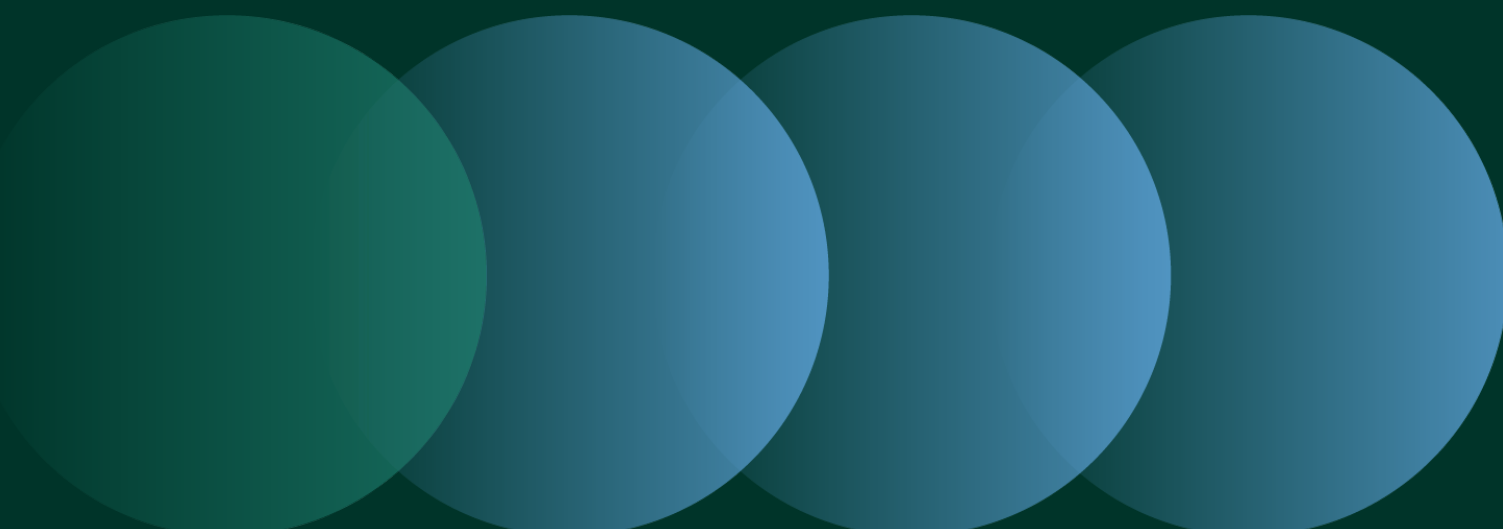

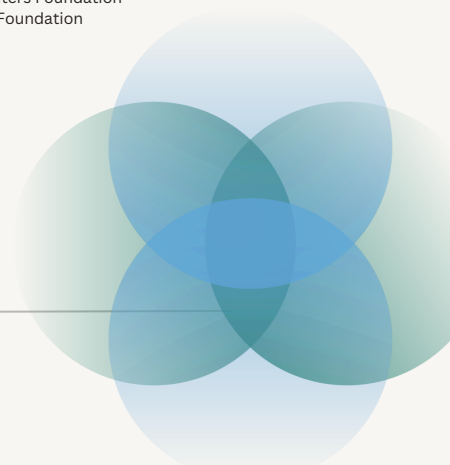

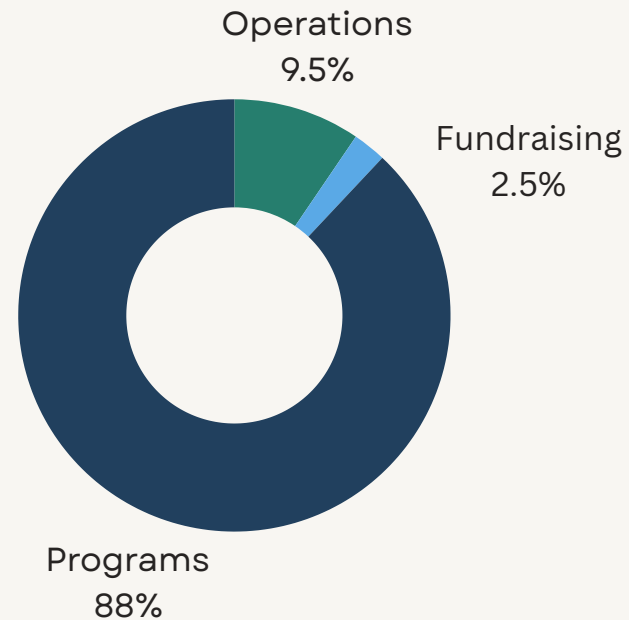

With 88% of expenses allocated to programs, 2.5% to fundraising and only 9.5% to operations, it reflects our focus on delivering transformative outcomes while maintaining an efficient and purpose-driven approach to resource management.
